

City description:

Budapest is one of the “youngest” European capital, though it has a history of more than thousand years, as it only became a single city occupying both banks of the Danube river with the union in 1873 of right-bank Buda and Óbuda with Pest on the left (east) bank.

Budapest belongs to the Central Hungarian region which has a core position in Hungary in geographic, economic and cultural sense. The Region consists of Budapest and Pest County, which surrounds the Capital. Its territory is the smallest of the seven statistical regions, but with its three million inhabitants, nearly two thirds of whom live in Buda-pest, it is also the most populous. Around half of the national GDP is produced in the region. The region is characterized by its central position and by the dominance of the Capital and its agglomeration. Based on the per capita gross domestic product it is the most developed region of Hungary.

How to get to the Budapest

By air:

Budapest, Liszt Ferenc Airport

Ways to reach the city, frequency and costs

From Liszt Ferenc Airport there are several ways to get in the city center:

By Public Transport (BKK)

Bus number 200E commutes between Terminal 2 and Kőbánya-Kispest metro terminal where you can take the **M3 (blue) metro towards Újpest Központ** to reach Deák Ferenc square in the city center.

To reach our venue, you can change there for **M2 (red) metro in the direction of Déli Pályaudvar**, and get off at Batthyány tér.

Tickets for public transportation priced 350 HUF are available at the airport from BKK at its customer service points; from the post office; the newsagents (Relay) and from ticket machines at the bus stop. It is also possible to purchase a ticket from the bus driver for 450 HUF.

During the period of validity (80 mins) transfers are allowed only on the metro network (M1, M2, M3 and M4). If you transfer to a bus, or a tram, you need to validate a new ticket.

By miniBUD

The miniBUD, the official Airport Shuttle Services provides a door-to-door transfer between the Airport and any point of Budapest and its fleet operates 24 hours a day. The transfer operates as a shared-ride service, which means that passengers travelling to/from the same/closely situated address are escorted in the same vehicle. The travelling time is optimized and supervised by a GPS-based fleet-monitoring system, which is capable of displaying the actual position of all vehicles in real-time.

Reservations: miniBUD's airport shuttle service should be ordered at least 48 hours prior to the departure of your flight on their website

By taxi

The official taxi company (Főtaxi) parks outside the airport terminals, you can order a taxi from their kiosk. The price to the city center is around 8000 HUF.

You can most easily access it by the red metro line (M2). The conference center is a couple of minutes' walk from the Batthyány tér (square) metro station.
